Welcome

Welcome to the worshipping community at Holy Trinity Micklegate. Our Priory Church is the sole survivor in York of a Pre-Reformation monastic house still in use as a parish church. Christian worship has taken place on this site for over 1000 years beginning with a monastery in Saxon times (when we were known as Christ Church). After the Norman conquest in the eleventh century, the monastery became known as Holy Trinity. The present church was part of the nave of the medieval abbey building, restored and enlarged at the beginning of the twentieth century. Little now remains of the medieval and earlier Saxon monasteries.

Our services are dedicated to the glory of God. As the great St Augustine once wrote “one who sings, prays twice”. We pray that both in the singing and in the silence, in the spoken word and in the grandeur and beauty of this place, you will feel that greater presence and find yourself surrounded and blessed by the peace that passes all understanding, promised to us by God.

A wide cross section of the community is represented by the people who gather Sunday by Sunday to worship God at the Sung Eucharist at 11am, which is one of our principal acts of worship. The Sung Eucharist is celebrated using Common Worship and the New Revised Standard Version (Anglicised) Bible translation. The new musical repertoire embraces the breadth of the western classical traditions.

The songs of the Old Testament play a central role in our worship. Despite their great age, they are often extremely relevant to our everyday lives. We celebrate the diversity of worship by singing the Psalms in various ways. At the Sunday Sung Eucharist, responsorial psalms are used, allowing the congregation to respond to the verses of the Psalm. It reminds us that the Mass brings us in communion not only with God, but also with the people around us in church and in the wider community.

Before each service, we keep still and quiet. In our hearts, we ask God to help us worship him. Music is an aid to bring us closer to God. In perfection of beauty we find love, holiness and truth. When, called by the bells, we come to worship our Creator, we answer the Psalmist’s call:

*O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness:
let the whole earth stand in awe of him.*
