All are welcome to attend in person or join in by telephone or internet.

- For the time being, a one-way system will be in operation.
  - Entrance: from Micklegate through the churchyard
  - Exit: through the West Door onto Priory Street
- In line with government guidance, all visitors (unless exempt) must wear face coverings during worship or while visiting for private prayer and sightseeing.
- There are hand sanitiser points for public use at the entry and exit – please do make use of these as you enter and leave the church.
- NHS Test and Trace: Holy Trinity has now been asked to take your contact details when you attend for worship. This will only be used if there is a need to contact you due to the Test & Trace programme. Consent forms are available at the entrance and can be deposited in the donation box by the entrance. We will hold this information securely and will destroy it after 21 days.

### Revision of Electoral Roll

**Forms are now available in church and online for people to be included in the electoral roll. Submissions will close on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> October.**

The electoral roll is a register of people who can take part in the annual parish meeting (to take place in late November) or nominate somebody to stand as a PCC member. You can stand as a member of the PCC if you have been on the electoral roll for six months. Most importantly, joining the electoral roll is a declaration of commitment to Holy Trinity, a way of saying "I belong". The number of members on a parish electoral roll is also an indication of the strength of a parish. We encourage all regular worshippers Holy Trinity to apply to join the electoral roll.
